# HISTORY

Kenya: When the Europeans arrived they started speaking Swahili language, a mixture of Bantu and Arabic. In the Colonial era the government started thanks to the Europeans. From October 1952 to December 1959, Kenya was under a state of emergency arising from the "Mau Mau" rebellion against British colonial rule. During this period, African participation in the political process increased rapidly. It became independent in 1963.
